# Online Payments November

FCCC is excited to announce that beginning on November 1st, FCCC families will have the option to pay their tuition online via Credit Card or ACH through their <u>myprocare.com</u> account. Currently available payment methods will remain in place for families who do not wish to pay through the online system. Payments made online will incur additional processing fees which will be calculated and charged automatically at time of payment. Credit card payments will incur an additional processing fee of 2.7% + \$0.30 per transaction. ACH payments will incur an additional processing fee of \$1.00 per transaction. Policies regarding in-person payment methods such as cash, check, or money order will not change and will incur no additional processing fees. We thank you for your patience as we bring this new system online, and we are excited to launch these new convenient payment options on November 1st.

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Dear Families,

As part of Fauquier County Community Childcare after-school programs, your child will have the opportunity to participate in a ten-week health program designed for elementary students. My name is Jameela Abdullahi, I will be the guest facilitator leading the Too Good for Drugs health program (Too Good). Too Good in elementary school teaches the fundamental elements of social and emotional learning through developmentally appropriate activities that set the foundation for a healthy adolescence. Lessons build the skills children need to set daily goals, identify emotions and feelings, and make healthy choices that contribute to their overall health and well-being.

Too Good is a nationally recognized program that teaches five essential social and emotional learning skills, which research has linked with healthy development and academic success:

- 1. Goal Setting
- 2. Decision Making
- 3. Pro-social Bonding
- 4. Identifying and Managing Emotions
- 5. Communicating Effectively

This year I will be incorporating the experiential learning model to the Too Good program. Experiential learning is a learning process whereby students "learn by doing" and by reflecting on the experience. Games and other activities will be shaped around the Too Good curriculum, giving students the opportunity to engage intellectually, creatively, emotionally, socially, and physically during each lesson.

I have spent the past few years working at Verdun Adventure Bound, a local non-profit organization that specializes in experiential learning. Verdun was established in 1999 with a vision to strengthen the community in which we exist by empowering individuals, communities, and organizations, to discover their unrealized potential and by fostering impactful collaboration. Verdun utilizes a multi-faceted challenge course, community partnerships, and natural resources in our area to provide custom experiences that connect people to each other and their community. Verdun promotes individual and collective growth through programs designed to meet the specific needs of our clients and our community as a whole.

I am excited to say that I will be implementing the Too Good program starting in Mid October 2023 at the Fauquier Community Child Care after-school program sites, Highland School, and Saint James.
